Fire District Builds Training Facility

The Fire District has purchased two 40-foot shipping containers that will be used to create a training building that can withstand live fire as well as be configured to simulate actual residential interior building configurations to be used by firefighters for practice.

With the acquisition of the property located on Little Fall Creek Road for the development of the Fall Creek Station, the previous Fall Creek Station building will be utilized for training and badly needed storage for the District. The placement of the shipping containers and the eventual construction of training props inside will be a significant asset to the District and will allow for enhanced training of District personnel.

Plans for the training facility include a roof prop, wood stove and flue prop, live fire prop, stairway and room configurations that will allow practicing of all forms of fire attack techniques. The project should be fully completed this winter and once completed, the facility will be available for use by our neighboring fire districts as well.

Lowell's 2015 Summer Science Camp a Success!

This summer, due to a generous grant from the Chintimini Fund through the Oregon Community Foundation, the Lowell School District was able to offer a summer science camp that served 18 students in grades four through twelve. This first time summer science camp focused on microbiology and molecular engineering. In addition to funding through the Oregon Community Foundation, Oregon State University supplied the teachers (Ms. Toni Taylor and Ms. Kay Graham) with technical assistance and specialized equipment that could not be purchased through the grant.

The science camp demonstrated how important bacteria and fungi are to our personal health and the health of the environment as well as focusing on how certain microbes can cause havoc to our population. The students learned about bacteria and how to enhance and control bacterial growth, food microbes and preservatives, water quality related to microbiology, medical microbiology and DNA extraction. Additionally the students used the gel electrophoresis process to analyze "DNA fingerprints" and were able to successfully complete a genetic transformation lab.

The week ended with students presenting a Microbiology "Slam" where students worked in groups to present something they learned during the camp or some new research they studied.

Special thanks to Glenda Green who wrote the grant and Mr. and Mrs. Weathers who let Lowell Students "invade" their water front so the students could collect Dexter Lake water samples. Lowell Jr./Sr. High School student teacher, Ramiro Quero, also stopped by one day to help with the electrophoresis lab. One of the great things about this grant is that the equipment used for the summer camp can be used during the year by Ms. Taylor for her general biology class and can be reused for other summer science camps in the future.

This report of actions taken by the Lowell City Council is a regular feature of this newsletter and is provided to inform citizens of recent decisions made by the council.

From the July 7th regular meeting:

- Approved Resolution 631—A Resolution Amending Resolutions 388, 389, 390, 454, 482, 500 and 522 to Update Systems Development Charges (SDC) for Fiscal Year 2014-15.
- Approved Resolution 632—A Resolution to Authorize a Change in Signatories for the City of Lowell General Account, Trust and Agency Account; All with Banner Bank.

From the July 21st regular meeting:

- Approved Resolution 633—A Resolution Amending the City of Lowell's Personnel Policies & Procedures Employee Manual Relating to performance Management Review and Compensation.

Having secured new legislation to allow the trash fish caught during the derby to be sold as crab bait, 1,257 pounds of pikeminnow (about 2,200 fish) were removed from the lake, helping improve the fishery and raising funds for the Lowell wrestling program.

Children from the Lowell Library Summer Reading Program visited the fire station and had the opportunity to talk with Firefighters, look and explore fire equipment and even had a chance to squirt some water on a make believe fire.

It's sometimes hard to tell who is having more fun, the little kids or the big kids.



Fire Danger Is High

As we progress into the later summer months, please remember that the grasses and vegetation around your home and around the general area is becoming more susceptible to fire. Here is a safety check list of things you can do to help make your property wildfire safe:

- Is your address clearly visible from the road? If you need an address marker, the district can provide one. Contact the district office.
- Is your driveway/roadway clear of obstructions, can a fire engine or other emergency vehicles get to your home? Driveways/roadway surfaces need to be at least 12 feet wide and have at least 13 ½ feet height clearance so the emergency vehicles can get to your home. Curves must be of adequate dimension to allow for emergency vehicle clearance, and there must be room for vehicles to turn around.
- Remove limbs and branches that overhang your roof. Prune lower limbs to a height of 15 feet and thin trees or remove them from within 30 feet of your home.
- Keep you roof and gutters free of debris, leaves, needles, small branches and moss.
- Keep woodpiles, firewood and other combustibles at least 30 feet from you home and out buildings.
- Block off openings under your home, and decks with solid sheeting or fine-mesh wire, 1/8th inch metal screen works best. Screen attic vents and louvers also.
- Use only fire resistive roofing an all buildings. Class A asphalt shingles, metal to tile.
- Develop an escape plan and an emergency action plan. If a wildfire occurs near your home, you should have a plan for evacuation that includes important personal items and escape routes. Build an emergency evacuation kit that you can easily take with you if you are asked to evacuate your property in an emergency.


